SOLID WOOD

- 1. Clean all spills as close as possible to when they occur as moisture can stain and damage the finish of the Timber. For best results, always wipe in the direction of the wood grain.
- 2. Clean the surface with a clean, damp micro-fiber cloth and a neutral cleaning spray to remove spills, stains and other deposits.
- 3. For more stubborn stains, Proceed to clean by gently rubbing the surface with a clean, soft non-abrasive cloth and a dilute solution of a mild dish soap in clean water.
- 4. Rinse the surface thoroughly after any cleaning with clean fresh water to remove any detergents or cleaners, as any product sitting on the surface may impact the finish. Be sure to not use excessive moisture and dry completely with a soft, clean cloth.

DO NOT Rub the surface excessively as this may mark and damage the surface.

DO NOTUse rough fabrics or metal scourers to clean Solid Wood as this may mark and damage the surface.

Use chemical or abrasive cleaners like Bleach, Gumption, Cream Cleaner, Polish Removers, Tile and Drain cleaners and solvents like Turpentine, White Spirits, Thinners, or Citrus based Cleaners as these may mark or impact the surface.

DO NOT Place hot items directly on the surface without a trivet or mat as this may burn or damage the surface.

Use hot or warm water when cleaning. Hot water will cause the timber to swell and deform and will affect the surface finish.

Place directly up against radiators, heaters or fireplaces as direct heat cam cause the Solid Wood to split or crack. A distance of at least 1 - 2 metres should be adequate to minimise any harm.

ALWAYS Ensure the cloth or sponge is clean, as anything on the surface can mark the Solid Wood.
